# **The Anders Utrecht Podcast Series**

We have launched a new <u>podcast series</u> that brings together scholars and grassroots initiatives. It celebrates the variety among existing initiatives that deal with societal challenges in creative ways, and fosters dialogue between these organizations as well as with affiliated scholars.

In this podcast series, representatives from initiatives enter into conversation with scholars to discuss how they tackle the challenges of sustainability transformation. These discussions explore the shared ideas between academics working on organizational alternatives and local initiatives experimenting with real alternatives to the default capitalist model. The podcasts illustrate the breadth and variety of grassroots organizations in and around Utrecht and show how much common ground there is for collaboration and transformation. They represent an important step in strengthening the dialogue between Utrecht University and grassroots initiatives, while drawing attention to the diversity of practices and ideas for social change that circulate amongst the members of Anders Utrecht.

Each episode focuses on urban life and informs the audience about major challenges and opportunities generated by grassroots initiatives. The episodes are released each month and follow the sequence below. Access the podcasts here.

# Master thesis defence of Winnie Ruizendaal

# Workshop on the future of Anders Utrecht and farewell to Belle

At the end of September 2021, the network members came together to discuss the future activities of AndersUtrecht. At the end of the workshop, we said farewell to Belle Tonk. She contributed immensely to building the network and producing podcasts as a dedicated project assistant.

#### **CITEUS Workshop contribution**

In November 2021, Anders Utrecht coorganized a workshop together with Open City Network and Citizen Engagement and Urban Sustainability (CITEUS) from Utrecht University's Transforming Cities Hub. The workshop explored how we can sustain long-term collaboration between citizens and the university for sustainable cities. The workshop was held at network member CASCO and was attended by academics and representatives from various civic initiatives. It was a great opportunity for participants to exchange experiences and ideas through presentations and group discussions. ### **Collaboration with teaching activities**

In December 2021, students visited CASCO as part of the course 'Organizing in a Changing World' to learn more about the practical aspects of 'commoning' and 'the commons' framework. Producer Marianna Takou shared her insights on alternative practices in the sphere of art institutes and explained how their 'assembly' functions to build ecosystems and networks. For the same course, members of 'Taste Before You Waste' Jody and Berend recently joined the class as guest speakers. They shared their practical sustainability knowledge on how TBYW problematizes food waste, gets organised autonomously, maintains their tasks, and contributes to their communities' well-being.

Juliette and Lis, two students from the Global Sustainability Sciences program at Utrecht University, developed a website that connects green actors and change makers in the Utrecht region with students that are interested in sustainability. *February* **15** – Studium Generale's 'een nieuwe blik op duurzaamheid' features a lecture by prof. dr. Maarten Hajer from Utrecht University reflecting on the shortcomings of current thinking about sustainability and what is needed for a truly sustainable future. **February 20 (recurring)** – Every third Sunday of the month, the Doughnut Economics Lab organizes an online co-learning group <u>meeting</u> to understand and explore tools for new economic and political systems for Earth.

*February 26 & 27* – The yearly <u>'2.Dh5 Festival for world changers'</u> is taking place in Amsterdam, bringing together groups, campaigns and individuals who are active in struggles around feminism, queer liberation, anti-racism, decolonization, solidarity, climate and more. The event will host a number of workshops, debates and discussions for participants.

*March 30* – The <u>'political imagination laboratory'</u>, held annually at the university of Perugia, examines the shifting political imagination of contemporary social movements and experimental forms of activism. This year, the theme is "utopias of sustainability – the sustainability of utopias". Scientists, filmmakers and activists are invited to submit papers and visual projects (documentaries) related to this theme. These will be presented during the event which will take place from 30/09/2022 to 1/10/2022.
